THE STORY OF VARIETY

Variety started in Australia in 1975 with Paul Hogan as our first Chief Barker (Chairman) and has separate representation in each State.

Variety has been operating for over 70 years.

It all started in 1927 in Pittsburgh USA when a group of 11 vaudeville showmen formed a social club called 'Variety'. On Christmas Eve in 1928 at a party at Sheridan Theatre, Pittsburgh, a member of the group found a baby girl abandoned in the stalls at the theatre. Attached to the blanket in which the child was wrapped was a note that read, "Please take care of my baby. Her name is Catherine. I can no longer take care of her as I have eight others" signed, a Heartbroken Mother.

The group decided to foster the child and named her Catherine Variety Sheridan. Her story became an inspiration to help children everywhere and since those early beginnings Variety has become an international organisation helping special children worldwide.

Variety is now spread throughout 14 countries. Variety operates across Australia each year approving millions of dollars in grants for equipment and services for children with special needs.
